

How to Revise


Retrieval practice: repeatedly recalling learned material without seeing it in front of you.

Pupillometry


Processing load: the brain can only do so many things at once (how hard the brain is working)




Using retrieval practice improved recall, and reduced processing load.




Recall in the short and long term were consistent with recall questions.



Using retrieval practice required less processing load.





Remember to start with only a few questions.
Student can test themselves (ensure they say answers out loud)
Parents can test students.
Repetition is the key.
