What you need to know

2 GCSEs - GCSE English Language AND GCSE Literature

Both subjects have TWO papers. They are not of equal value: Paper 2 carries more weighting in both exams.

How to revise - one way doesn't fit all!

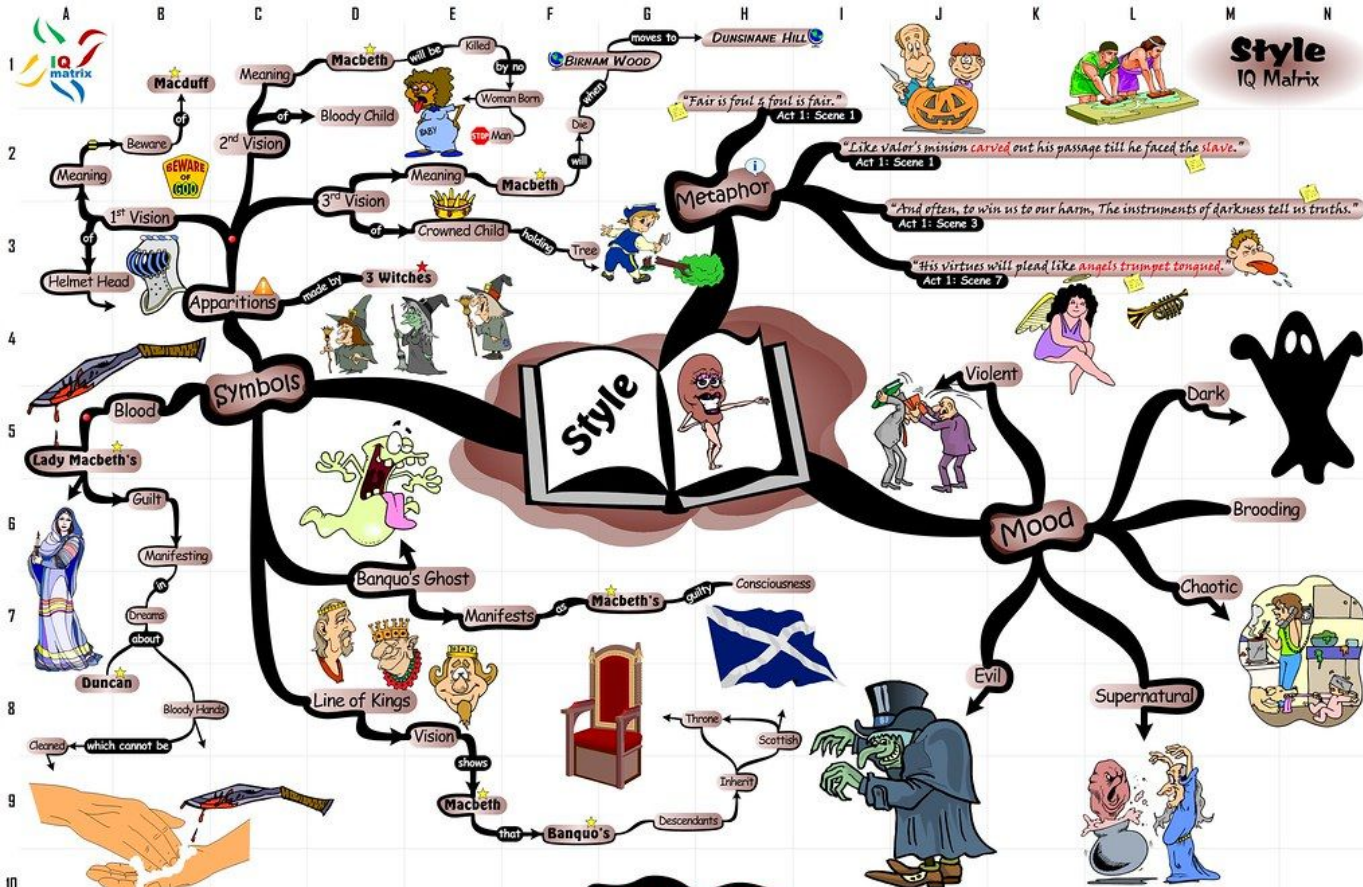
Practise practice and past papers.

Practise writing responses to a timed schedule.

Make sure you are familiar with WHAT the exam board are looking for you to do on each question. (Be aware! We have changed exam board, so older siblings will have answered in a different style.)

Practise the skills verbally at home: encourage evaluative discussions; analyse the sport you watch with your young person; synthesise similar topics, identifying similarities and differences.

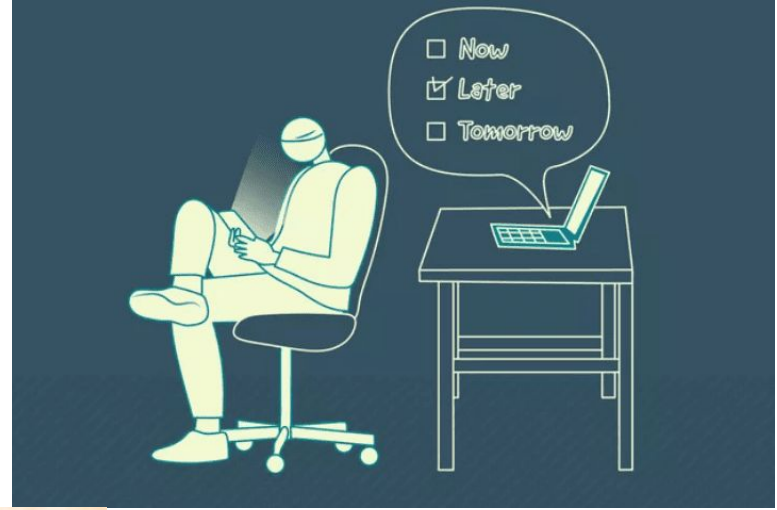
