



Dear Parent/carer,

Introduced in 2011, the pupil premium fund is a sum of money given to schools each year by the Government to improve the attainment of the following students;

- Students entitled to free school meals based on their family income.
- Students whose families are in receipt of certain benefits.
- Students in care (LAC)
- Students previously in care who have been adopted, or who have a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order.
- Students recorded as being from service families.

Your child qualifies for pupil premium fund because of one of these reasons. This gives us a great opportunity to support your child in many different ways. I plan to meet with the students who qualify for pupil premium in the coming term in order for them to have a better understanding of the support available in school for them.

Schools can choose how to spend their pupil premium money, as they are best placed to identify what would be of most benefit to the students who are eligible. We use this funding in the following way: -

- Extra one-to-one or small-group support for students.
- Employing extra teaching assistants to work within classes.
- Pastoral and student welfare support.
- Providing KS4 revision guides.
- Support and funding for educational trips and visits.
- Basic lesson equipment available from the student welfare office.
- Help with uniform.
- Funding support to access music lessons.
- Making sanitary products available.
